Mining publications of the West which have struggled with the postal department for second-class mail privileges, and butted against the stone wall of a department conclusion which would not be altered, will sympathize with the effort being made to have established the right of appeal from post office department officials to the courts on such questions as the fraud order, classicals, etc. For a period the officials of the department held to the ruling that a mining paper publishing the boosting reports usual or the average mining camp, forfeited its right to second-class privileges, unless its mining news embraced more than one district. This ruling was adhered to after the officials were shown that some of the papers covering several districts had more of the "hot air" news than those confining their optimism to a single district. But because there had been a ruling, it had to stand.

In regard to fraud orders, there has been little complaint, save from victims who had attached to operations a strong shade of suspicion. Issuance of a fraud order is a great power, but one that seems not to have been abused in such manner as to enlist public interest. It is probable that whatever is finally done in the way of giving court review to complainants coming from the post office department, will be confined to fraud order cases. The committee on judiciary of the House has made this recommendation. Such action would not be with the purpose of impeaching the post office officials for misuse of their power in any wilful sense, but merely to insure important interests that judicial hearing that has been held sacred in all important civil affairs of the country.

The agricultural settlement bill has passed both houses and received the signature of the President on June 12. Applications for the classification and listing of lands chiefly valuable for agriculture within forest reserves will be received by the Forester, Washington, D. C. from this date. The forest preference right to enter lands listed under this Act, will be given to persons who have settled upon lands prior to January 1, 1906, and the second preference right will be given to persons who apply to have the classification made, but this latter class should not apply for the classification of a tract occupied by a settler before that date; otherwise, they might lose their preference right. No examination of more than one-quarter section will be ordered upon the application of the same person, but is an application is withdrawn or rejected

All applications must give the name of the reserve and describe the land, examination of which is requested, by subdivisions, section, township and range if surveyed, and if not surveyed, by reference to natural objects, streams or improvements with sufficient accuracy to identify the land. Areas known to have been occupied by actual settlers prior to January 1, 1906, will be examined first, and when such areas are found chiefly valuable for agriculture they will be listed, in order that the occupants may make entry under the Act. The mere fact that a man has settled upon land, will, however, not influence the decision with respect to its agricultural character. For any further information, kindly address, Howard K.
