Notice is hereby given, that the Water Committee of the City of La Grande, will receive sealed bids up until 4 o'clock of the 15th day of June 1906, for the performance of the following work to-wit:

Making an excavation ten (10) feet deep and building a cement and concrete wall in said excavation ten (10) feet high, including a space nineteen (19) feet long, and thirteen (13) feet wide, and flooring said space with cement and concrete work, said walls and said flooring to be each six (6) inches in thickness. In the center of said floor to be firmly set and placed a stone foundation three (3) feet thick, four (4) feet wide and eight (8) feet long. Said work to be performed at the City Pump Station, and all persons seeking to bid upon the same will call upon the City Engineer for specifications as to quality and character of work required.

Said work will be let to the lowest responsible bidder, and each bid must be accompanied by a certified check of not less than 10 per cent of the price paid for said work, and the Water Committee hereby reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

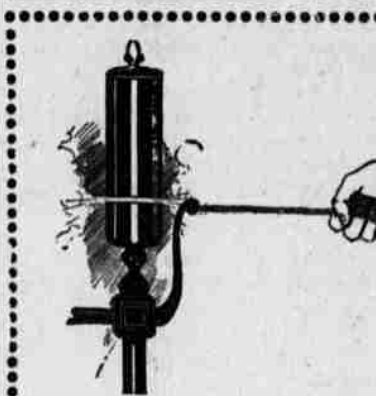
