The virtual system of negro slavery established in one of the counties of southeast Missouri suddenly stopped when Uncle Sam discovered it. It may result in some more servitude, but it will be of a penal nature.

It will cost the government \$300,000 just to secure the blank paper on which to print the supply of paper currency for 1907. This will prove a good investment however, because Uncle Sam will manufacture the paper into notes and bills with the face value of \$765,000,000. The biggest item in this total is the \$5 denomination in which there will be \$184.-000,000, there will be 95,000,000 onedollar bills and \$140,000,000 of fivedollar certificates.
