The virtual system of negro slavery established in one of the counties of southeast Missouri suddenly stopped when Uncle Sam discovered it. It may result in some more servitude, but it will be of a penal nature.

It will cost the government \$300,000 just to secure the blank paper on which to print the supply of paper currency for 1907. This will prove a good investment however, because Uncle Sam will manufacture the paper into notes and bills with the face value of \$765,000,000. The biggest item in this total is the \$5 denomination in which there will be \$184,000,000, there will be 95,000,000 one-dollar bills and \$140,000,000 of five-dollar certificates.

Under a law of Minnesota, a state medical board is constituted with directors to procure samples of all patent medicines sold in that state and subject them to a careful analysis. The contents of each medicine will be published in a weekly bulletin to be issued by the department, which will be given wide circulation. If the medicines contain opiates, alcohol or other deleterious substances, the fact will be published together with the quantity.

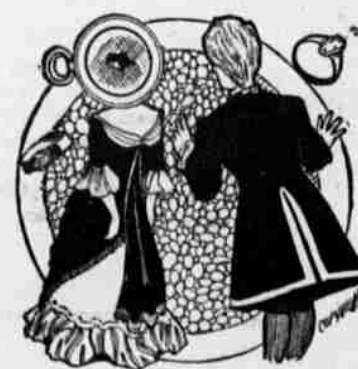
