Scripps News Association) Chicago June 22-Richard convicted of the murder of Mrs. Bessie Hollister on January 12. of this year was executed by hanging in the county jail this noon. The crime for which Ivens was executed was one of the most attrocious attacks upon women in the police history of Chicago. On the evening of January 12 Ivens was standing at Belden Avenue an alley near Lincoln Avenue when Mrs. Hollister came by. He accosted her, pursued her half way across Burligg street muffled her out cries by holding his hand over her mouth and nose and dragged her into a dark corner at the rear of his father's carpenter shop There he fiendishly assaulted her and murdered her by twisting a copper wire around her throat. The body was found the next morning half hidden under a pile of rubbish in the lot.
