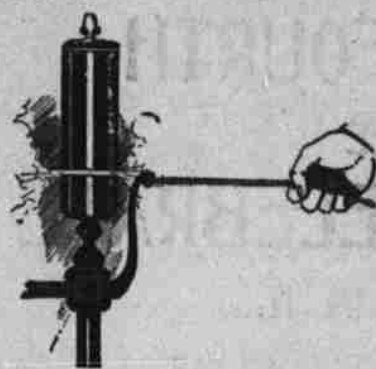
A pleasant social hour was enjoyed and all were unanimous in pronouncing it one of the most enjoyable and unique afternoons ever given in La Grande.
