THE VETOED ORDINANCE

The following are the essential features of the ordinance vetoed.

Section 1 provided for a license to be issued for less than six months.

Section 2 proscribes in general the mode of procuring a license the most important feature being that the petitioner will not during that period of his license, violate any law of the state of Oregon, or any ordinance of the city.

Section 3 fixes the bond at \$2,000 to be given by not less than two sureties which are firmly held and bound to pay the full amount lost to any person or persons at any unlawful game within or upon the premises, during the term of said license, and that we are firmly held and bounden for the payment of any and all damages in any suit that may be brought by the wife, family, or relatives of any person who shall during the term of said license, become or is permitted to become intoxicated by the use of any such liquors so sold, delivered and drank upon the premises.

Now if the said applicant shall keep an orderly house and in all things comply with the provisions of this ordinance, permit no gaming or riotous conduct in or about the place or premises therein, said liquors shall be sold; that he will not open nor permit to be open his place of business for the purpose of traffic on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday; that he will not give, sell, supply or deliver intoxicant liquors to any minors or habitual drunkards, nor to any person in a drunken or intoxicated condition, and shall pay the full amount of all moneys lost by unlawful gaming, and shall pay the full amount of damages secured by any wife or relative of any person, who shall become or is permitted to become intoxicated upon said premises during the term of said license, then this bond shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

Section 4 prohibits riotous or disorderly conduct, selling liquor to any minors, or persons already intoxicated, prevents the employment of women to sing, dance or as waitresses or their presence during any hour, day or night. Violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and when convicted before the city Recorder shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$300 nor more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not less than one day, nor more than 90 days or by both fine and imprisonment and in case of conviction for selling liquor to a minor the unexpired portion of said license shall be forfeited to the city.

Our soil is rich and productive. Were we to mention yields they would not be believed. The only way to become acquainted with this "Garden of Eden" is to personally visit this land of diversity, as when you see the crops growing and harvested they speak for themselves.

Our forests will require many many decades of the present activity before they begin to yield and we now have thirty or more saw mills which give employment the year round in the mills and logging camps

The only sugar beet factory in the state is located at La Grande, the County Seat of Union County with a population of 5,000, progressive wide awake people who extend the glad hand to all. This is the commercial, educational and social center of the county.

La Grande is known as the railroad town of the O. R. & N. Co. whose annual payroll at this place exceeds \$500,000.00. From here the branch road is now pushing through the northern part of this county, on into the Walla Walla County, starts a freight division, machine shops, round houses, and one of the largest railroad yards on the system, and train dispatchers office. The public schools of La Grande are second to none in cities of this size in this state. We now have three buildings and a fourth, an eight room brick building in course of construction, giving employment to twenty-two teachers. The principal office of the Grande Ronde Electric Co. is located in this city. This Company furnishes power and light for the city of La Grande, Island City, Cove, Union, and the Hot Lake Sanatorium.
