The boy was taken to St. Elizabeth hospital where all efforts to save him from the, deadly tetanus were in vain. Death came about 5 clock Sunday morning.

The pistol, the instrument of death, was one of those small affairs made to LOST-A Lady's gold handled parasol shoot blank cartridges, with one of these in his gun the child was playing. In shooting the pistol he received the discharge in the palm of his left hand.

The funeral occurred this afternoon at 3 o'clock at the family residence, Rev. Finger of the M. E. Church officiating. Interment was made in Mt. Hope ceme-
