Washington, D. C. June 27-A genera erder will be issued from the War Depantment in a few days, giving instruction in regard to the exemises of the mobilization of troops in the summer at Mount Gretna and the othersix camps of concentration. It has been decided to hold se sham battles and to indulge in nothing of a spectacular nature. The work of th troops, both regular anti-militia, will confined to practical operations and exercises which tend to harden soldiers to out-of-door life and train them for the hardships and exposures of field work There will be abundant marches and night bivouace away from the regular camps. There may be at each of the camps a final review, which will be attended, as far as possible, by distinguished officers It is possible that Teneral Bell, chie of staff, will visit all of the camps some time in their existence, provided he can leave his work in Washington. This may not be possible for any length of time, since is assistant. Gen. T. H. Barry, will, a part of the time, be absent in Europe. where he goes with other officers, includ ng General P. W. Duvall, to witness the German army manoguvres. Arrangements have also been made for a representative of the General Staff at each of the camps for the purpose of tachnica observation of the work of the troops.
The officers who have charge of the camps, such as Geveral Grant, at Moun Gretna, where the New York militia will be sent, are enjoined to see to it that there is the least possible amount of a soldiers' show, and that exerything be done to give the camp a serious and businesslike aspect.
