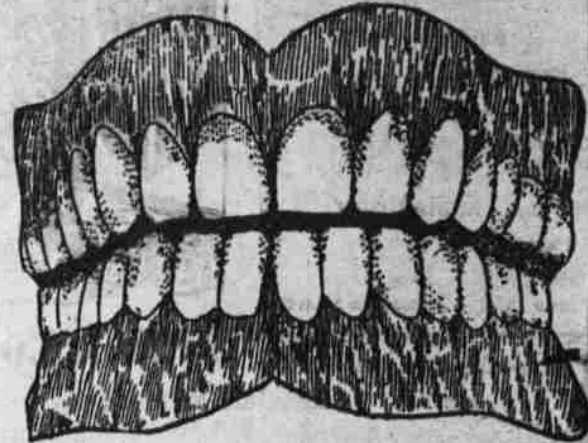

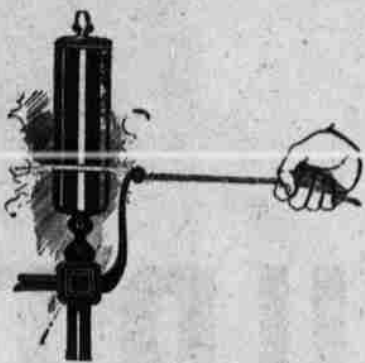

proof of the actual design people have the right to exercise reasonable intelligence and judge of results; they will draw their own conclusions and all the bluster and pretensions to the contrary will not change that opinion.

The mayor thinks there is nothing mysterious about law-municipal or constitutional; that is to him. Of course lawyers study for years to learn it and are required to submit to an examination and license by the supreme court before having the privilege to construe law and give advice respecting its construction. But of course a mayor has the egotism without any preparation or legal knowledge to assume that he can make technical application of the law-construe to the public what an ordinance for the public welfare demands, shall mean, and set up his opinion against attorneys who do know its legal effect and whether constitutional. The public will rely upon the latter for the meaning of such ordinance.

The mayor's articles in print are interesting to the public. Unexpectedly and inadvertently he was drawn to divulge his motives, calibre and plans to deceive the voter; they are sign posts against a re-election, an education and object lesson for future municipal contests. Finally to show the drift of sentiment elsewhere and as a corroboration of my position that high license does not necessarily depopulate a town or decrease its revenue, I call from the Chicago Herald of the 17th inst, an article entitled "The Saloons Under High License—respecting affairs in Chicago."

"During the fight to increase the saloon license fee from \$500 to \$1,000 the brewers and liquor dealers' organizations insisted that the 'poor saloon-keeper' was being persecuted; that he was going to be driven out of business, even up to half of his total strength in the city, and that the net results of all the 'persecution' would be that the city would either have no increase at all, or very little increase in its revenue. It is interesting therefore, to note what happened.

The license year begins May 1. Up to June 15 last year 6,956 licenses had been issued for the four months' period bringing the city a total of \$1,165,409.65. Between the same dates this year 6,484 licenses have been issued bringing \$5,258,019.52.

The falling off in the number of saloons as shown by the figures up to date, has therefore been only 472, or less than 7 percent. The total amount received by the city from saloon license including bar permits, in the whole of the last license year was \$5,938,798.35. Already this year, therefore, on payments for the first half alone, the city has come within \$700,000 of securing as much revenue as it did in the whole of last year.

In each of these license periods last year there were about 8,000 saloons listed. Some increase, therefore, may be expected this year. But even if the average number of saloons for the year is not greater than the figure licensed up to June 15 the year's increase in revenue will be \$2,500,000.

Perhaps more licenses have been taken out, experimentally at the beginning of the new arrangement than the conditions of the business will permanently warrant. Perhaps, also, in view of the probability that an ordinance will soon be passed limiting the total number of saloons in the city hereafter, the breweries have been anxious to be on hand early with licenses for the best locations. But even if such facts as these have swollen the number of licenses, it is clear that from the financial standpoint the city acted most wisely in adopting high license.

It is not to be expected that the same result will be obtained in this city, the result will be a greater loss in number here, yet the article quoted is interesting to show that the reduction will not be great, and also to show that the number of licenses can be limited by law, and if the result desired is not obtained by the usual course of business, then this city has a right to say the number of licenses shall be put to a fixed number to prevent the "business" being too numerous for the public good. With malice towards none but charity for all.
