### EXPERT TESTIMONY

Californians are noted for their loyalty, and it might be imagined that the tremendous energy and enthusiasm which they are displaying in the reconstruction of their great metropolis was only another, though unusual, evidence of the same sentiment. But the Federal Government is not swayed by such feelings. Distant from local influence, it weighs the evidence pro and con and then acts with due deliberation. Immediately after the great fire it became necessary to award the contracts for carrying mail across the continent for the next four years. For thirty-five days before the fire the postal authorities had been weighing the mail, and so convinced were they that the importance and growth of San Francisco would be unimpaired and uninterrupted, that the Department accepted the result of the weighing test as an indication of the prosperous future and awarded the contracts on that basis.
