TORPEDO BOAT CRUISE

(Scripps News Association)

Norfolk, Va. July 7.—It is more of a problem than some people think to send the torpedo boats from here to the Asiatic station, and the difficulty of getting under way was resulted in an indefinite postponement of the proposed transfer of these boats to the distant station. The boats were to have started out early in April, but they are now laid up in ordinary, with no prospect of making the trip in the first place the boats would have to be tested singly to determine, without question their respective steaming radius. Then, the convoy which would tow them on occasion, would have to be taken along the coast with the boats for the purpose of drilling the crew and acquainting the officers with the method of handling boats. The danger of trouble is much greater with the small craft than with the big drydock, and no one pretends to believe that the long trip would be free from mishap; some fear it might involve the loss of a boat or two. The authorities are in a great quandry and few of them are willing to take the responsibility of advocating the long voyage. On the other hand, the naval authorities on the Asiatic station wish to have the boats sent out.

Boston, Mass. July 7.—An unprecedented number of fine big schooners and other craft, including the Elminia, Corona, Constellation, Constance, the flagship of Commodore W. Amory Gardner, Vice-Commodore Lewis Clark's Emerald, Henry Morris' new schooner Dervish, W. S. Eaton's Taormina, the Doris, the Gloriana, the Humma, the Heron and many others, started from here this morning on the ocean cruise of the Eastern Yacht Club, which ends officially at Bar Harbor, Me., on July 14. The runs will be as follows: Today to Gloucester; July 8, to Wood Island, off Biddeford Pool; July 9, Christmas Cove, near Boothbay; July 10, Camden; July 11, proceed at will to Islesboro; July 12, Dark Harbor to Cranberry Isle; July 13, to Bar Harbor. On July 14 there will be a disbanding dinner and presentation of prizes at the Kobo Valley Club.

NORTH AMERICAN TURNER BUND

(Scripps News Association) Newark, N. J., July 6.—The biennial convention of the North American Turner Bund opened here today and will continue until July 11. About 250 delegates, representing all the Turner societies in the United States are in attendance. The delegates are instructors in physical and ethical education and other thinking men from the various societies. The principal work of the convention will be the adoption of a declaration of principles for the government of the Turnerbund societies throughout the United States.

ENGLISH SWIMMING MEET

London, July 7.—The first of the English championship swimming meets takes place here today. The number of entries is unusually large and includes several prominent American swimmers.

The hundred-yard contest will be held at Nottingham on July 16, and is of particular interest to Americans, because Daniels is accorded a first class chance to win that event if he can maintain the form he has shown at the recent indoor championships.
