**GENERAL NEWS**

B. Radcliffe sold 20,000 pounds of wool at Billings, Mont., for 22 1/2 cents per pound, to Jones & Donald, of Boston.

At the June examination for admission to the Annapolis Naval Academy, 146 passed and 97 failed. Those who passed must yet be examined for physical qualifications.

Yakima county is putting a set of steel cells into the new jail, at a cost of \$7516. A Canton, O., firm, furnishes the material complete. All that is needed is to assemble and rivet.

All the fish in the upper end of Lake Pend Oreille are dying and coming to the surface, making an awful stench. They are the victims of a parasitic worm which superficially resembles a tapeworm.

Upon July 4, 38 persons were killed outright in the United States by fireworks, explosives and other "celebration casualties," while 2780 were injured by similar causes. The number killed was four fewer than on July 4, 1905, while the number injured, 358 greater.

Peter Barrie and Peter Reane of Deadwood, S. D., went up on Bald mountain the night of July 4 to explode dynamite as an extra effort at an observance of the day. No one knows how it happened, but the dynamite all went off at once and both were blown to atoms.

The wealthiest negro in the United States is Cody Bryant of central Georgia. He is worth between \$75,000 and \$100,000 in farming property, without a dollar indebtedness, all accumulated since the war. He was a slave and was freed by the emancipation proclamation when 30 years of age.

**ORDINANCE NO. 329**

Series 1906.

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of the city of La Grande to enter into a contract with J. L. Mars for the construction of a sidewalk on Fourth street in said city.

The City of La Grande Does Ordain as follows:--

**SECTION 1** The Mayor and Recorder of the City of La Grande is hereby authorized and instructed to enter into a contract with one J. L. Mars for the construction of a board sidewalk on the east side of Fourth street, from the south side of I street to the north side of C street in said city, for the sum of \$772.10.

**SECTION 2** That said contract shall provide that said sidewalk shall be built under the supervision of the Street Superintendent of said City, who shall make the same comply with the requirements of the Ordinances of said City, and subject to the approval of the Street Committee.

**SECTION 3** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the 11th day of July, 1906, and shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed by the Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, by 6 Councilmen voting therefor, and no Councilmen against the same.
