Washington July 10—Secretary of Agriculture Wilson says pending the decision upon the effect locally of infected tuberculosis meat will permit such meat to pass into the market as the government pathologists agree that the infected part may be removed and the remainder eaten without harm. The secretary has not decided finally upon the passing of diseased meat but pending further investigation the doubtful will be continued.

A trip along the Willowa river into this fast developing region is interesting at almost any time of the year and particularly pleasant in the heated season.
