NOTICE OF RESTORATION to Settlement, Entry, Filing and Selection of Lands within the former Baker City Forest Reserve, Oregon. Department of the Interior, General Land Office, Washington, D. C., March 28, 1906. In pursuance of the proclamation of the President of the United States, dated March 15, 1906, excluding from the former Baker City Forest Reserve, partly embraced in the Blue Mountains Forest Reserve, Oregon, the area described below, and restoring to settlement the public lands therein, notice is hereby given that the said public lands will become subject to entry, filing and selection, under the usual restrictions, at the United States Land Office at La Grande, Oregon, on July 18, 1906: In Township eight (8) South, Range thirty-eight (38) East, Willamette Meridian, the west half of the north-west quarter and the west half of the south-west quarter of Section thirty-five (35); in Township nine (9) South, Range thirty-nine (39) East, the west half of the north-west quarter and the west half of the south-west quarter of Section twenty-nine (29); and the west half of the north-west quarter of Section thirty-two (32). ORDINANCE NO. 330

Series 1906

An ordinance defining departments, and prescribing methods for the transaction of City business.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:—

SECTION 1 The recommendations of the Finance Committee in its report submitted to the Council, and by said Council at its regular meeting on the 20th day of June, 1906, together with forms submitted with said report, are hereby adopted, and all city officials are hereby required to use such forms in the transaction of all city business.

SECTION 2 That the Mayor and Recorder are hereby instructed and ordered to enter into a contract with Glass and Prudhomme in the sum of \$319.20 for the purchase of the books and files recommended by the Finance Committee and in accordance with the bid made by Glass & Prudhomme, and this day accepted by the Council.

SECTION 3 That for the purpose of carrying into execution the recommendations of said report, and systematizing the transaction of all city business, the following departments are hereby created and defined:—

1. Judiciary; Law, Ordinances, Rules, Order of Business, Franchises, Bonuses.
2. Fire, Police, and Insurance; Insurance, Fire Department, Police Regulations Impounding cattle, Enforcing Dog Ordinances.
3. Health, Sewer and Water; Public Health, Sewerage, Water Supply, Water Works, Water Distribution, Drainage.
4. Streets and Alleys; Streets, Alleys, Sidewalks, Parks, Street Lights.
5. Finance; City Revenue, Disbursements Indebtedness, Accounts, Bills, Books, Records, Filing System, Auditing.
6. Ways and Means; Outstanding Warrants, Bonds, Sources of Revenue, Taxation, Licenses, City Property not under other Departments.

SECTION 4 Each Department shall make a report in writing, signed by a majority of the members thereof, of all business transacted by his department, together with the recommendations of such department at each regular meeting of the Council. 5+

SECTION 5 That each Department shall hold a Department or Committee meeting at the call of the Chairman thereof, in the Recorder's office, at a time not less than 5 days prior to each regular meeting of the Council, and at such meeting the City Recorder shall place at the disposal of such Department all the records and files of his office for investigation, or to be used by said Department in making its report or recommendations.

SECTION 6 All recommendations, reports, petitions, claims against the City, and other matters submitted in writing, shall be filed with, and remain in the custody of the City Recorder, subject to the inspection and use of his office by any officer, and at any Department meeting or by any one interested in the subject matter of such report, recommendation, petition, or other matter on file or of record in his office.

SECTION 7 The City Recorder shall upon application supply to each City officer, Head of Department, or any other person requiring or entitled to the same, the necessary blanks, at the cost of the City, for properly carrying into effect the purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION 8 Any City official, subordinate officer, or other person duly authorized, wishing to obtain either labor, supplies or material at the expense of the City, shall first make a requisition therefor to the proper Department, which Department may authorize the purchase of such material or supplies, or the employment of such labor as shall be necessary to carry into effect any existing contract, or to perform any necessary duty on the part of the City of La Grande, unless the total costs therefor to the City shall exceed one hundred Dollars when such purchase or employment shall be made by ordinance.

SECTION 9 Such requisition shall be signed by the Official or person in charge of such work, and counter-signed by the chairman of the Committee in charge of the Department authorizing the purchase of such material or supplies, or the employment of such labor and such requisition shall specify the class and kind of material, supplies or labor required, and when and where the same shall be used. Said requisitions to be made in duplicate by the Recorder, the original to be signed by him and the duplicate to be kept on file in Recorder's Office.

SECTION 10 This Ordinance shall be full force and effect from and after the 12th day of July, 1906, and published in one issue of the Evening Observer.

Passed by the Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, this 6th day of July, 1906, by five Councilmen voting therefor. Approved this 6th day of July 1906. J. B. STODDARD, Mayor.
