An ord nance granting a franchise and right of way to the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company upon and along Marion Street in the City of La Grande

The City of La Grande does ordain as Follows:-Section 1. It is hereby ordained and

Navigation Company, a private corporaness under and by virtue of the laws o the State of Oregon, and its successors in interests' shail have a perpetual franchise and right of way upon and along Marion Street in the Ci.y of La Grande Oregon, from the intersection of said A liberal reward will be paid for the road Company in said City, extending North the entire length of said Street as now laid out, platted aud dedicated to

> Section 2. The franchise and right of way shall be for the purpose of constructing and operating along and upon said street or any portion thereof, a roadbed and railway of standard gauge in width and that over and upon said road-bed and road-way all kinds and classes of freight and passengers may be transported and keeping said railway in proper repair.

Section 3. That said Railroad Company shall not so occupy or use said street either in the construction or operation of said roadbed and railway as to prevent the same being safely and coneniently used for public travel and use. nd that said Railroad Company shall provide and cons ruct at the crossing of each street along the line of said franchise and right of way, a suitable, convenient and safe crossing for public travel across said railroad track upon said cross street.

Section 4. That the said Oregon raiload and Navigation Company shall lay said track upon said street in accordance with the present grade, and shall from a distance of one foot on each side of the end of the ties and between the rails of the track lay said track in such a manner by ballasting oa planking or otherwise that the same shall conform to any improvement or grade established now or hereafter by said City; that said track shall at all times be in a good and passable condition for teams.
