Rev. L. K. Robinson has regular preaching appointments now at Elgin and North Powder.

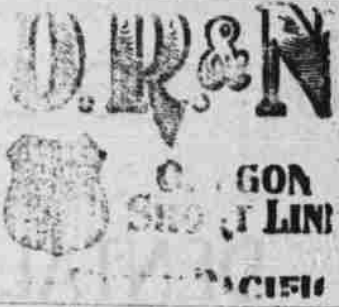
