**ORDINANCE NO. 332**

Series 1906  
 An ordinance concerning the removal and disposition of all kinds of garbage, waste, rubbish, manure, offal, empty boxes cans, or like material, and for the appointment of a City Garbage Officer and Inspector.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:—  
**SECTION 1.** It shall be the duty of the Council of the City of La Grande, to appoint a City Garbage Officer and Inspector immediately upon the passage and approval of this ordinance, who shall hold his office until the regular time for the appointing other City appointive officers, and until his successor shall be appointed and qualifies.

**SECTION 2.** It shall be the duty of the Council each year at the time for appointing other city officers provided for by the Charter and City ordinance of La Grande to appoint a City Garbage Officer and Inspector, who shall hold his office one year from the date of such appointment, or until his successor shall be appointed and qualifies.

**SECTION 3.** The Council may at any time, for what to them appears sufficient cause, remove such officer, and declare said office vacant, and appoint his successor.

**SECTION 4.** Such Garbage Officer and Inspector shall receive no compensation from the City of La Grande for his services.

**SECTION 5.** It shall be the duty of said Officer and Inspector to carefully inspect all public streets and alleys of said City and all private and public property on which complaint as to its condition is made, or the public health may require and require all owners or occupants to keep such property at all times, clean of all such substance as generate noisome or unwholesome odors or gaseous vapors, unless the same are entirely condensed, decomposed, or deodorized without in any manner offending or endangering the public comfort or health. He shall also require all owners and occupants of property to keep clean and remove from all streets and alleys abutting the same all kinds and character of rubbish, garbage manure, decomposing or decaying vegetable matter, empty cans, boxes, or other loose, offensive, unwholesome, or unsightly substances, provided always, that if the said city garbage officer and inspector shall enter into contract with the owner or occupant of premises, to remove and dispose of the garbage, rubbish, and other matter herein described, said property owner or occupant shall be responsible for violating this ordinance.

**SECTION 6.** Said officer and inspector before entering upon his duties as such, shall enter into a good and sufficient undertaking with the City of La Grande conditioned for the faithful performance of all his duties, imposed upon him by the terms of this ordinance, and for the faithful performance on his part of all contracts he may enter into with the owners or occupants of property for the removal and disposition of garbage, rubbish, and other matter as herein set forth, to the satisfaction of the Street Committee, he shall be held liable, upon proof thereof for violating the provisions of this ordinance, to the same extent as the owner or occupant might be for failure to remove and dispose of the same as herein set forth.

**SECTION 7.** That if said garbage officer and inspector shall fail, refuse, or neglect to perform his contracts with owners and occupants of property for the removal and disposition of garbage, rubbish, and other matter as herein set forth, to the satisfaction of the Street Committee, he shall be held liable, upon proof thereof for violating the provisions of this ordinance, to the same extent as the owner or occupant might be for failure to remove and dispose of the same as herein set forth.

**SECTION 8.** It shall be the duty of such garbage officer and inspector to perform all services required of him by the provisions of this ordinance under and by the supervision, and according to instructions given him by the Street Committee of said City.

**SECTION 9.** Any person, persons firm or corporation, failing, neglecting or refusing, when notified by said garbage officer and inspector to remove all of any such garbage, rubbish or other matter herein mentioned within 48 hours from such notice, or who shall in any manner violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall, on conviction thereof before the city Recorder, be fined not less than \$5 nor more than \$25 or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than 5 days, nor more than 25 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

**SECTION 10.** This ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after the 15th day of July, 1906, and shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed this 11th day of July, 1906, by the city Council of the city of La Grande, by 8 Councilmen voting therefor and no Councilmen voting against the same.
