CELEBRATING FALL OF BASTILLE

(Scripps News Association)
 Paris July 14—The one hundred and seventeenth anniversary of the fall of the bastille, which may be called the Fourth of July of the Frenchmen, was celebrated today in the customary manner. The whole city was decorated with tricolors and practically the entire population of metropolis was on the streets from early morning till late at night. Bands played everywhere and the jolly people danced wherever they found room and could hear the music—on the asphalt pavements of the streets, on the public squares, and even on the sidewalks. Hundreds of thousands of Parisians and tourists from all parts of the world gave themselves up to pleasure. There was a grand military review by the President and his staff. Tonight the whole city will be brilliantly illuminated and there will be fireworks and free patriotic performances in all the subsidized theaters. During the day there were many meetings and parades of patriotic societies and all the revolutionary monuments were decorated. This afternoon President and Madame Fallieres drove to the Longchamps race course to attend the opening of the races. They were received everywhere with the greatest enthusiasm.

Paris, July 14—The Longworths today attended a review of French troops during the celebration of the fall of the Bastille. They occupied President Falliere's box.

DAIRY CONTEST AT 1906 FAIR
