**ORDINANCE NO. 333**  
Series 1906.  
An ordinance establishing the street and sidewalk grades upon certain portions of S street, in La Grande, Oregon.  
The City of La Grande ordains as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The grade of the street upon S street, in La Grande, Oregon, from and to the points herein mentioned is hereby established as follows: Commencing at the center of the intersection of Monroe avenue and North Fir street, at an elevation of 8.50 feet below the base established for the grades of the streets and sidewalks of said city; thence east along and upon the center line of said S street to point at the east line of Greenwood street of said city, at an elevation of 13.60 feet below said base; thence east along and upon the center line of said S street to the center of its intersection with Valley street at an elevation of 15.20 feet below said base.

**SEC. 2.** The grades of the sidewalks for said street shall be at the same relative elevation as other sidewalks heretofore established by ordinance in said city.

**SEC. 3.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the 20th day of July, 1906, and shall be published in one issue of The Evening Observer.

Passed by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 11th day of July, 1906, by 8 Councilmen voting therefore and 0 Councilman voting against the same.
