PURCHASE DAIRY HERD

Mr. Sawyer, manager of the Pierce farm, formerly known as the Wade farm, has purchased the Peach Brothers herd of Jersey dairy cows, and will take them to the farm near Hot Lake. With the cows now on the farm this will make a combined herd of sixty cows, the largest individual herd in Union county. Mr. Sawyer expects to continue to enlarge his herd until it reaches one hundred head. Mr. Sawyer has arranged to sell his cream to the Blue Mountain Creamery Co. of this city, and has ordered a large De La Val cream separator and expects to be ready to furnish butter fat by the last of next week. Union county is fast becoming one of the foremost dairy counties in the state, and the end is not yet. The amount paid for his herd is said to be forty dollars per head.

IMPOUNDING NOTICE

Notice is hereby given to the owner of cattle, horses, and fowls that the ordinance prohibiting certain animals and fowls running at large within the city, from and after this date, July 11th, 1906 will be strictly enforced.
