Railroads arehungry for ties. Accordng to a report published by the United States forest service, railroads of this country purchased more than 80,000 000 cross ties in the year 1905. Of this aggregate 47% consisted of oak and 22% of pine ties. Of pine ties used the southern states furnished 81%, and Rocky Mountain district 10% or oak ties, the central states supplied 54%, the southern states 33% and the North Alantin states Preservative treatment was given about 10% of the total number of ties bought last year.


