#### PENNSYLVANIA MILITIA IN CAMP

(Scripps News Association) Gettysburg, Pa., July 21-The division campment of the National Guard of Pennsylvania officially opened this morn ing, although the advance guard came here several days ago to arect tents and prepare everything for the sheltering and maintenance of the troops and for the organization of the various dunes connected with the provest, commissary and other departments. Part of the troops arrived yesterday evening and nearly all the rest during this morning. By afternoon alt the troops included in the division encampment will be in full running order.
