GENERAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Thunderstorms with damaging winds occurred during the early part of the week in a few localities in the northeastern portion of the State. The rainfall attending the thunderstorms was generally very light and the damaging high winds were confined to relatively small areas generally located in mountainous sections. A rain of consequence occurred in the western counties. The temperatures were above normal but it was not so warm as the preceding week especially in the western counties where, as a rule the mornings were cloudy and the afternoons clear.

In the eastern counties the sunshine was bright and practically continual during the entire week and the afternoon temperatures were nearly as high as during the preceding week but the mornings were considerably cooler.

ANXIOUS FOR PROMOTION

 Washington July 24—Naval officers on the retired list who saw service in the Civil War some one hundred in number are anxious to be promoted to the next higher grade on the retired list as authorized by the recently passed Naval Appropriation act. This is the same kind of promotion as last year or two ago accorded to army officers. There are evidences of impatience on the part of retired Naval officers who feel that the Naval Department should be ready to promote them without delay. It will take some time however to accomplish this as each case must be carefully examined as to the records to ascertain whether the claimant is really entitled to the benefit provided by law.

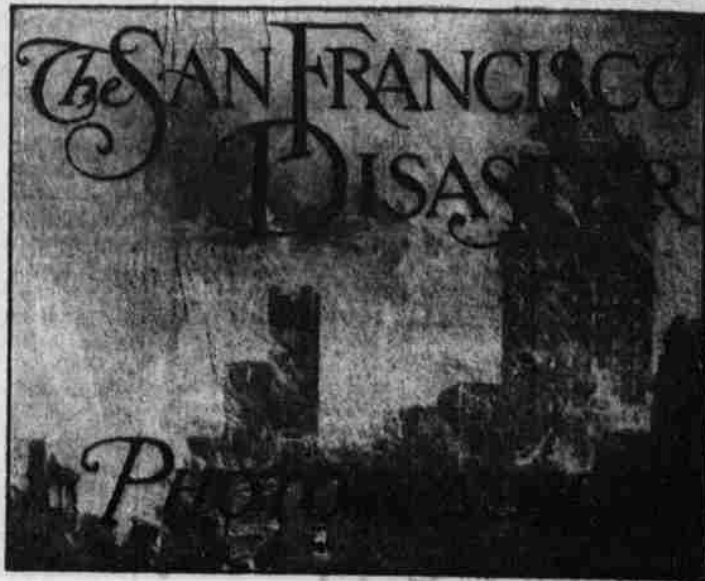
