The first wheat sale of any importance this season became known today when it was learned that C. H. Brown & Co., which consists of Messrs. Brown, Maloney and Hodgins, had recently contracted their entire yield for the price of 58 cents. The wheat was purchased by the Pacific Coast Elevator Company, through Will Moore, local agent.

Threshing was commenced on the Maloney-Hodgins place over a week ago, and so far about 10,000 bushels have been threshed. The total yield is estimated at 16,000 bushels.

While several small purchases have been made by the various buyers of the city, no deals of importance have been made outside of the above, if the statements of the brokers are to be relied upon.—Pendleton East Oregonian.
