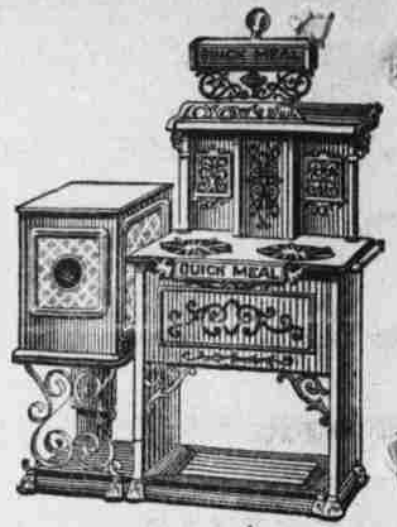

DON'T BE AN INDIAN

Lewiston Teller: It is said that an Indian never forgets a slight nor forgives an injury. He will wait a lifetime to get even. This characteristic is not confined to Indians. There are plenty of others who pride themselves upon the fact that they never forget a kindness or forgive an injury. Indeed, is not this the standard by which most persons regulate their living? And while remembering kindness shown is commendable it is an indication of pitiable character weakness to harbor resentment for real or fancied injuries. There can be no worse hell here or hereafter than that which the individual makes for himself who harbors a feeling of hatred or resentment. Some one has said: "The man who considers himself a Nemesis who treasures up a wrong, who nurses an injury, who lets ignoble hatreds fester in his heart, cannot be a happy man. His soul is like a crouched tiger ready to spring upon the victim of his wrath. If it is easier to put on record in the memory personal grievances and to hug an ugly feeling, it is because we have chosen to do so. If we hoard up in the mind the unhappy episodes of life it is because we have formed the habit of doing so." We should learn to forgive, if not forget. And through the act of forgiving we can become capable of forgetting. Learn to forget! Life is too short and human happiness so difficult an attainment that none can afford to detract from his own or another's happiness through harboring resentment or hatred. Learn to forget!

Never lose sight of the opportunity to call capital attention to the possibility of extensive irrigation in this valley.

La Grande should send a strong delegation to the irrigation congress which will meet at Boise in September. Irrigation should receive every possible attention from the residents of this valley and much valuable information could be gathered by attending this meeting. It might also be the means of attracting capital to this section of the country.
