CROP CONDITIONS FOR JULY 1, 1906

The crop Reporting Board of the Bureau of Statistics of the Department of Agriculture finds, from the reports of the correspondents and agents of the Bureau are as follows:

Preliminary returns show that acreage of corn planted to be about 96,535,000 acres an increase of about 1,624,000 acres or 1.6 per cent as compared with the estimate of the acreage planted last year.

The average condition of the growing crop on July 1, was 57.5 as compared with 87.5 on July 1, 1905.

The amount of wheat remaining in the hands of farmers on July 1 is estimated about 46,053,000 bushels equivalent to about 6.6 per cent of the crop last year. The acreage of potatoes excluding sweet potatoes is less than that of last year by about last year 58,000 acres or 1.3 per cent. The average condition on July 1 was 91.5 as compared with 91.1 on July 1, 1905, 95.9 at the corresponding date in 1904 and a ten year average of 92.1.

The acreage of tobacco is less than that of last year by about 40,000 acres or 5.2 per cent.

The average condition on July 1 was 86.7 against 84.7 one year ago.—Government Crop Reporter.

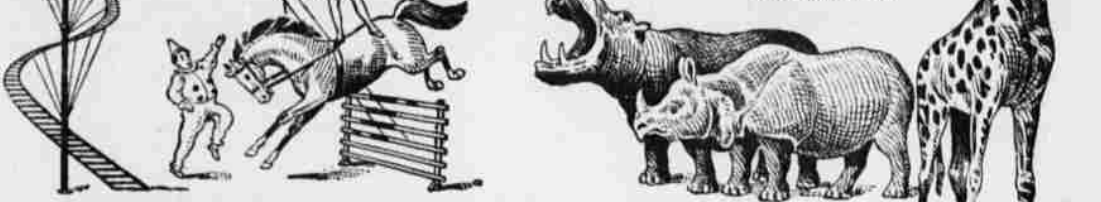
