SITE FOR RESERVOIR PURCHASED

The Wm. Grant's Agency reports the following real estate sales, 40 acres near Summerville to Walter Williams by S. L. McKenzie consideration \$840 and the 160 acre farm of W. S. McMillan of Starkey to Walter Pierce. It is understood that the latter sale is the beginning of an extensive irrigation project and this land will be used for reservoir purposes. Those who are familiar with the location say that this site will permit of large reservoir that can be stored and used when needed during the irrigation season. The value of the waters of Grande Ronde river are just beginning to be realized and Walter Pierce is simply using his usual business foresight. NICKELL GETS THIRTEEN MONTHS

Charles Nickell of Medford, Oregon, formerly United States commissioner, found guilty July 27, in the United States district court of having conspired with Henry W. Miller, Frank E. Kincaid and Martin G. Hoge to defraud the government of a portion of public domain, was sentenced to 13 months imprisonment on McNell's Island by Judge Hunt. Pending an appeal, Nickell was permitted his freedom under a bond of \$6000.

A little more than half a crop is the estimate he places on it. Last year he shipped fifteen carloads of watermelons, each car averaging 1600 melons. This was about three-quarters of his entire crop, which was good last year. The intensely hot weather has reduced the yield this season. The same is true of cantaloupes as reported by A. Sechler, who is the largest producer near The Dalles.—Dalles Chronicle.
