ORDINANCE NO. 331

Section 1. It is hereby ordained and ordered that the Oregon Railroad and Navigation Company, a private corporation, organized existing and doing business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oregon, and its successors in interests shall have a perpetual franchise and right of way upon and along Marion Street in the City of La Grande, Oregon from the intersection of said Street with the right of way of said Railroad Company in said City, extending North the entire length of said Street as now laid out, platted and dedicated to public

Section 2. The franchise and right of way shall be for the purpose of constracting and operating along and upon said street or any portion thereof, a roadbed and railway of standard gauge in width, and that over and upon said roadbed and roadway all kinds and classes of freight and passengers may be transported and

Section 3 That said Railroad Company shall not occupy or use said street either in the construction or operation of said roadbed and railway as to prevent the same being safely and conveniently used for public travel and use, and that said Railroad Company shall provide and construct at the crossing of each street along the line of said franchise and right of way, a suitable, convienient and safe crossing for public traval across said railroad track upon said cross street.
