MAY PARDON UPTON

Governor Chamberlain has under consideration a petition for the pardon of George Upton, of Columbia county, who is serving a life sentence for the killing of William DeJournette, in May, 1898. A commutation of the sentence has been recommended by Judge McBride. DeJournette was killed during a drunken brawl, and Upton was found guilty of manslaughter. It seems that Judge McBride has taken some interest in this particular case. A petition for the pardon of Upton was presented to Governor Geer in 1902, but no action was taken, and the matter was again brought up before the public by the recommendation of Judge McBride.—Pendleton Tribune.
