A lone robber at Baker City, Monday night held up a saloon. The bandit secured \$425 and made his escape.

Fruit and crops were damaged considerably in Baker County by the recent wind storm.

William M. Brown, a prominent stockman of Pauline, Crook county, Ore., has just made a cash gift of \$10,000 to Pendleton academy to be used in the erection of a boy's dormitory and manual training department.

Chesterfield, the palmist who has been touring the northwest for some time, has been tempted by the ways of fate. Mixed drinks, and many of them, caused this man to read in his own palm that he should kill his beloved wife. After an unsuccessful attempt to accomplish this he was forced by the police to leave Baker City.

People of Caldwell, Idaho, raised \$40,000 in one night to build a railroad.

The county clerk at Pendleton yesterday had issued nine hunters' licenses up to two o'clock; Deputy County Clerk Bramwell issued twenty-four before eleven o'clock. At two o'clock yesterday Umatilla county had issued one hundred and sixty-nine; Union county 353.

OREGON'S BIG FOREST FIRES

According to the latest reports, Oregon has lost as much from forest fires as San Francisco lost in the recent earthquake, the only difference being that Oregon's loss comes annually by degrees.

Timbermen, as usual, are not surprised at the prevailing forest fires this fall, and it is reported that such rich districts as Santiam are now endangered. Oregon has nearly twice as much standing timber as Washington. The burned area largely exceeds the cut area, and all measures taken to prevent this seem to be useless. Every year adds to the enormous loss, pruning the resources of the state in a terrible manner, and taking it altogether is a loss of millions of dollars to the state.

Accepting government figures, the 5000 square miles of burned forest in Oregon once supported 54,000,000,000 feet of the best timber on earth. In computing the state's enormous timber resources government officials place the average stand of commercial timber on the forest lands west of the Cascades at 17,000 feet per acre.

Stringent measures should be adopted to stop much of the forest fire loss, as it is very often caused by carelessness. Efforts will be made in this direction, Pendleton E. O.

Validation for return—Tickets must be executed for return by Southern Pacific agent at Salem or at the Fair grounds. If not properly validated they will not be good for return from Portland.
