TO STOP SMUGGLING OF ARMS

(Scripps News Association)

London, August 18.-Though the Foreign Office the Board of Trade has recived a copy of a note from the Russian Ambassador to the effect that the clandestine importation into Russia by sea of arms. ammunition, and explosive, was assuming considerable proportions, and the ordinary customs vilgilance was no ionger sufficient

In comformity with an article in the Russian Code, which provides that in case of necessity the vessels of the Russian Navy should co-operate with the Customs authorities for the discovery and seizure of contraband, the Russian Government had decided to reinforce the ordinary surveillane of the Customs in the Baltic Sea and its gulfs by means of Russian war vessels empowered to inspect and effect the arrest of suspected
