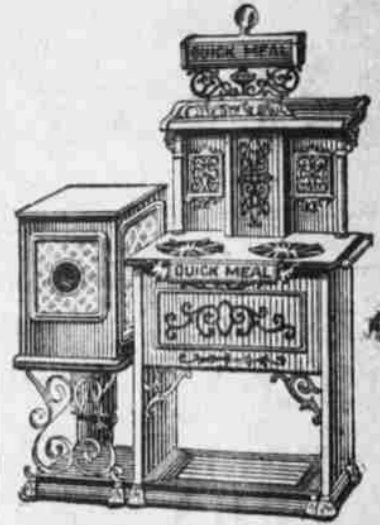

This local pride and love of home and the home town is one of the strongest of human feeling when once it is deeply planted. It should be cultivated in every possible way. The danger it threatens can only be obviated by awaking the people at large to a realization of it.—Maxwell's Talker.
