## GEORGIA POLITICIANS PUT UP LAST FIGHT TODAY

One of the most Bitter Primary Fights in History of State

Savannah, Ga., August 22.—The Democratic primaries are held in this state today and with them ends one of the most bitter and exciting political campaigns this state has ever known. Not since the war has there been a race for the office of governor in which so much bitterness has been displayed and so much personal abuse has been practiced. There were not less than five candidates: Hoke Smith, former secretary of the interior in the cabinet of Grover Cleveland; Clark Howell, former speaker of the House and former president of the senate of Georgia and now a National Democratic committeeman and editor of the Atlanta Constitution; Col. J. H. Estill, editor and owner of the Savannah Morning News; Judge Richard B. Russell, formerly of the Superior Court, and Col. James H. Smith of Oglethorpe county in Northern Georgia, about the only millionaire farmer in the state. Hoke Smith was formerly the owner of the Atlanta Journal and that paper helped him in his campaign. It is believed that the Journal was largely instrumental in getting Hoke Smith to enter the race because of its rivalry with the Atlanta Constitution.

There always has been a great deal of personal animosity between Hoke Smith and the Howells and for thirteen months Smith and Clark Howell have fought a bitter and vicious fight against each other. Col. Estill did not enter the race until about seven months ago. His organ is the Morning News, which he owns. Col. Smith recently started a paper of his own to present his platform to the people. There have been only four joint debates during the campaign and it is not believed that their influence will be felt by anyone of the candidates. Hoke Smith has openly charged that the other candidates have combined to defeat him. He declared that their candidacy was merely a trick of the state machine to bring about his defeat, by preventing him from getting a two thirds majority in the state convention.

Hoke Smith had the most radical platform of any of the candidates. He stands for a law to keep the negroes from voting. He wants to take them out of Georgia politics by the North Carolina, the Mississippi or the South Carolina plan. He worked this plank for all it was worth especially in the country districts, while for the cities he had another plank, demanding equitable railroad rates.

During the entire campaign Hoke Smith has had the warm support of Thomas E. Watson, former Populist candidate for President of the United States. There are at least 20,000 Populists in Georgia who worship Watson and will undoubtedly follow his lead. They will cast their votes for Smith if they can manage to get their votes in the ballot boxes.

Judge Russell has been running as the poor man's candidate. He has a big family and is so proud of it that he seldom neglected to speak of it during his campaign speeches. He has ten or twelve girls and one was born during the heat of the campaign. In one of his speeches he said that it would be one of the proudest moments of his life, to parade his cotton-gowned children up Peachtree Street to the Governor's mansion.

Col. Estill made his second race for governor. He ran four years ago and was second in a field of three. His platform is short. He stands for the constitution of the state and the enforcement of the laws. It is not believed that he has much show at the primaries. However, he may come in as a "dark horse" in the convention, which will be held in September. In case none of the candidates should secure sufficient delegates to control two thirds of the total number, a "dark horse" may be sprung upon the convention and win the prize. Although Hoke Smith's managers are hopeful, it is by no means considered certain that he will secure the necessary number of delegates to control the convention. The Democratic state convention will meet in Macon on September 4.

### STILL ON THE ROCKS

Honolulu, Aug. 22.—All efforts so far to float the Pacific liner Manchuria which when on the reef off Rabbit Island early Monday morning, have proved fatal.

And there is new small hopes of saving the splendid ship. Her middle now rest upon the reef and it is feared that she will break into two as she is laboring heavily. It is also thought that her engines have rendered useless by the continuous pounding. The passengers have all been removed to a place of safety.
