UNION COUNTY IS NOW BEING RAPIDLY DEVELOPED

All we need is More People, the Foundation for Their Support is Being Laid

An Observer representative visited Union yesterday and was royally entertained a few hours by Mr. Cleaver, president of the Central Railroad Company, who drove us about the city and along the route of the road where active work is being pushed.

About fifty men are now engaged and this week all of the grading and most all of the bridges and trestles between Union and the Cove will be completed. For several miles along the road bed the ties are already distributed. Thousands more are now stacked in Union and at one time yesterday we counted five wagons headed towards the junction and each loaded with forty ties that were the equal of anything on the main line of the O. R. & N. Co. Three carloads of railroad steel are sidetracked at Union depot, twelve more cars are on the way this side of Omaha. This is a little more than sufficient to lay the fourteen miles of track, including the three mile branch to Hot Lake, to the Cove.

Within a few days not later than the last of this week a corps of engineers will be in La Grande to run the several lines over which the road will run from Moss Chapple through Fruitdale into La Grande.

Mr. Cleaver stated that the grading on the line from Cove to La Grande would commence just as soon as the right of way was secured and that he hoped to be able to complete the road not only to La Grande but from La Grande to Summerville as well, this fall.

While the promoters of this road have said very little during the seemingly long period of preliminary work, which has necessarily cost thousands of dollars they have paid all their obligations promptly and have not asked the citizens of the county for anything in the shape of donation or stock subscriptions.

This valley is certainly fortunate in securing such transportation facilities promptly without the asking and it

means more than any of us realize in the immediate development of this valley. This will make possibly hundreds of small farms along the forty miles of road in the valley and touching all of the commercial points places them all on an equal footing with preference to none.

Union county with her many rural deliveries, her superb telephone connections and transportation accommodations and possibilities of irrigation certainly has a future unequalled in the Northwest. "Keep your eye on Pasco" and "watch Tacoma grow" will apply with force to Union county.

With transportation and water, Grande Rondo valley will become one perfect garden easily supporting a population of 50,000 prosperous people.
