SECTION I The Mayor and Recorder of the city of La Grande are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with the Grande Ronde Electric Company, a private corporation, organized, existing and doing business under and by virture of the laws of the State of Oregon.

SECTION II That said contract shall provide that said lights shall be of 1200 candle power and shall be in lieu of the lights now furnished said city of La Grande by said company. SECTION III This ordinance shall be
