GOOD PRICE IS EXPECTED

Few or no Rogue River apples have been sold yet by the growers, said John D. Oiwell, of Medford, yesterday, and when the market opens they expect to get from \$2.50 to \$3.00 a box for the best fruit. The export crop this year will amount to about 150 carloads, 30 per cent of which will be Spitzenbergs and 30 per cent Newtowns. About 60 carloads of pears have been exported this year, to all parts of the East.

Within two or three years Rogue River's crop of Spitzenberg and Newtown apples and Bartlett and Winter pears will be considerably increased by new orchards coming into bearing. When Oregon arto attend the second Rogue River went into apple culture. some 15 years ago, the growers planted a number of varieties of apples, without knowing the special advantage of the Spitzenbergs and Newtowns-varieties that have since taken the chief place in the apple culture of that place, and Hood River In the last few years, the steadily increased, and will continue to be augmented.-Ex.


