THE STAGE

The forthcoming engagement of Maude

nary interest. In her appearance this

CALIFORNIA REPUBLICANS MEET

(Scripps News Association)

Santa Cruz, Sept. 5.—The State Con-
vention of California will meet here this
afternoon. The number of delegates,
which are apportioned on the basis of the
vote for Roosevelt in 1904 will be 825.
San Francisco will have 159 delegates,
Los Angeles 125, Alameda 76, Santa
Clara 34 and Sacramento 26. A full
state ticket will be nominated and Con-
gressman James N. Gillett will probably
be the successful candidate for the
gubernatorial nomination.

DAN KELLY WILL SURELY

WIN HIS RECORD

Secretary Sullivan of the A. A. U. has
informed the representative of the union
in Spokane that the matter of Kelly's
record has been left for verification with
Bert Kerrigan, of Portland, Oregon.

This is taken as meaning that the
worlds records of 9-5-5 seconds made by
Dan Kelley at Spokane at the north-west
field meet here will be accepted and
Spokane will get the credit for the fast
time. It is also taken as an indication
of the fairness with which the eastern end
of the union wishes to treat the west.

will be more able to deal with the matter,
being able to deal with the proofs exactly
