Canton, O., September 14.—This being the fifth anniversary of the death of the late President William McKinley, thousands made the pilgrimage to his tomb today, decorating it with flowers until it resembled a bank of flowers. Carnations, the favorite flowers of the late president, came in profusion. Mrs. McKinley visited the tomb early in the morning and laid fresh flowers on the sarcophagus. Gifts of flowers were sent by distinguished persons from all parts of the country. Among them were some from President Roosevelt, Secretary of Agriculture Wilson, Justice Day and many others.
