Sharpshurg, Md., September 17-The nonument erected in memory of the Third Fourth, Seventh and Eighth Reserves of Pensylvania, who fell in the battle of Antietam will be unvailed this afternoon with imposing ceremonies. The monument was erected by the State of Pennsylvania and today was selected for the dedication; as it is the forty-fourth unmversary of the battle. The State of Pennsylvania provided free transportation to the battleffeld for the survivors of the regiments and several hundred of the availed themsalves of the opportunity to isit again the scene of the that bloody pattle in which so many of their comrades fell. An interesting program has been arranged for the exercises and there will Se several addresses by prominent speak-

ers, music and singing. The battle of Antietam was one of the most important conflits of the great war. and proved to be the bloodlest.

The battle was the result of an attempt of the confederates to capture the city of Washington, in the expectation that Maryland would then join titter cause and insure the final victory. The federal army was commanded by Gen. Geoge. B. McGlellan, and the conferates by Gen. Robert E. Lee.

On the 17th the real battle was begun by Honker, who drove back the left wing of the left, wing of the confederates under Jackson, while Gen. Burnside engaged their right wing. The battle raged around a com-field surrounded by woods; to which Hooker had driven the enemy. The federal troops were twice repulsed, but gained the position on the third attack Hooker was wounded, and the command fell to Gen. Summer. Meanwhile on the extreme left Burnside had twice unsuccessfully tried to cross the A. but at 5 p to drove the enemy until a range of ills occupied by batteries checked him-At 4 o'sloock he was ordered to take the osition at any cost, and took the first sattery.
