or submitting offers for the furnishing of Chinese laborers or Coolies for the work on the Panama Canal expired at ten o'clock this morning and the bids received up to that time were opened by the members of the Panama Canal Commission. The basis for bidding is for twenty-five hundred collies, but it is probable that additional bids will be received, should the experiment prove successful. Every bidder was required to deposit a certified check for \$50,000. The bond of the successful bidder will be raised to \$100,000 which will be forfeited if he should fail to enter into a contract in accordance with his hid. The contract will remain in force for two years. The Chinese laborers will be required to work ten hours a day and overtime will be paid for all work in excess of that time or all work done on Sundays or legal holidays.
