# THIS IS JEWISH NEW YEAR

(Scripture News Association)  
New York, Sept. 20--Here as well as throughout the world the Jews are celebrating their New Year today in the customary manner. There will be services in all temples and synagogues, with music and special features. As usual the Jews will celebrate the day with feasting and countless chickens, ducks, geese and other fowls will be consumed. The Kosher butchers, who have the exclusive privileges of killing the fowls for the Jewish market in the orthodox fashion, came very near spoiling the New Year celebration this year and making it a day of fasting. According to long established rules an allowance of one Cent per fowl is made for the killing according to the Kosher rules. This tax was heretofore not paid to the men who did the actual work, but to the dealers, who have formed a trust and completely control the market. A short time ago the Kosher butchers went on a strike and demanded that the tax should be paid to them and not to the trust. The matter was compromised at the last minute and there was no scarcity of fowls in the market.

# OPENING BIDS FOR COOLIES

(Scripture News Association)  
Washington, D. C., Sept. 20.--The time for submitting offers for the furnishing of Chinese laborers or Coolies for the work on the Panama Canal expired at ten o'clock this morning and the bids received up to that time were opened by the members of the Panama Canal Commission. The basis for bidding is for twenty-five hundred coolies, but it is probable that additional bids will be received, should the experiment prove successful. Every bidder was required to deposit a certified check for \$50,000. The bond of the successful bidder will be raised to \$100,000 which will be forfeited if he should fail to enter into a contract in accordance with his bid. The contract will remain in force for two years. The Chinese laborers will be required to work ten hours a day and overtime will be paid for all work in excess of that time or all work done on Sundays or legal holidays.
