THE TRADE CONGRESS IN SESSION

(Scraps News Association) Milan, Sept. 24 - The second international Congress of Chambers of Commerce opened here today in connection with the World's Fair at this city. The international organization of Chambers of Commerce, which has its headquarters at Brussels, is an important body, consisting of representative delegates appointed by Chambers of Commerce in all parts of the world. Several large American cities are represented in the organization. Besides Chambers of Commerce several of the most important commercial organizations of the country, like the Southern Cotton Association and the Interstate Cotton Seed Crushers' Association are represented by delegates at the convention. The congress will only last two days. The object of the organization and of these conferences is to establish reciprocal relations between the merchants of different countries and a better understanding of the needs and the character of the business interests in various parts of the world.

CENSUS OF LA GRANDE CHURCHES

Tomorrow night, if present arrangements materialize, the church census of La Grande will be definitely known. The churches of the city have united to enact this work and beginning with tomorrow morning promptly at eight thirty Sunday school workers of the various churches of this city will begin a systematic canvass of the city to secure a Sunday school census.

At that hour, representatives from the Presbyterian, Christian, Episcopal, Baptist and Methodist churches will assemble at the Central church and after being assigned to districts of the city will make a house to house canvass, procuring facts and figures that will make up the census report.

Every residence in the city will be visited, and the inmates questioned as to what denomination they belong, how many children there are, and whether or not they attend any Sunday school, if not, why not, if the parents attend any church or Sunday school and if so, which denomination. When all the districts have been covered with these questions, and the returns from each enumerator footed up the churches will have in their possession much valuable information.

Next Sunday is Sunday School Rally day and these efforts are to bring, if possible, every child in the city, to some Sunday school next Sunday morning.
