Smith, who is a widower without children, has made several bargains under similar conditions and is considered a very shrewd and decidedly original man.

SPANISH TAUGHT AT UNIVERSITY

The University of Oregon has established a new department that of romance languages, which will be under the charge of Dr. Timothy Cloran, who just returned from a year's travel in France and Spain, arriving in Eugene this week. Here tofore the university has offered courses in French with the instructor under the direction of Professor F. G. G. Schmidt professor of modern languages and literatures. But with the coming of Dr. Cloran, Spanish will be added to the university curriculum, and there will be opportunity for broader work in the department of Germanic language and literature under Professor Schmidt.

GENERAL WEATHER SUMMARY

The fore part of the week was clear and unusually warm, especially during the afternoons, when the temperature ranged between eighty and ninety degrees in the western counties between the Coast and the Cascade ranges of mountains. Along the west slope of the Coast range of mountains it was not so warm, due to the mornings being usually foggy and the sea breeze being cool. The fog generally lifted during the latter part of the forenoon and the afternoons were sunshiny. During this period the afternoon temperatures in the counties east of the Cascade mountains ranged between ninety and ninety-six degrees in the low valleys and between seventy-six and eighty two degrees in the higher valleys. By the middle of the week the temperature in the western counties was about ten degrees lower, but in the eastern counties it continued unusually warm. The last two days were much cooler in all parts of the state, and in the western counties good rains occurred, which were attended by blustering winds that were not sufficiently high to cause damage. During this period the weather in the eastern counties was cloudy and threatening, but no rain of consequence fell and the winds were not strong.
