REVISED RULES OF FOOTBALL

The football rules as compiled by Walter Camp are not as radical as many think. While the style of play is more open the principles and general rules are identical with last year's rules.

The forward pass will not likely be a factor in scoring. Roughing the ball back or any one who has punted, is punishable by half the distance of the goal line. The penalties are more severe than last year is every thing and if enforced will do away with much of the roughness. The ends will play an important part in advancing the ball.

Following are some of the most radical changes, as given in Walter Camp's rules for 1906:

The opposing rush lines will be separated by the length of the ball which must be kept flat on the ground by the center. There are two rush lines one on each end of the ball.

Line men must have both feet, both hands, or one foot and the opposite hand up or within one foot of the line, and with the exception of the three center men the forwards must stand with both feet outside of the man next to them.

Before making a fair catch a player must signal by raising his hand clearly over his head.

Whenever any portion of a player carrying the ball, except his hands or feet, touches the ground when in the grasp of an opponent, the ball is down.

Hurdling the line or any individual, is prohibited.

The snapperback is allowed to have his hands and head offside when he is about to pass the ball.

None of the five center men will be allowed to leave the line unless he goes five yards back and another player takes his place in his line. No sniffling to evade this rule will be allowed.

A team must gain 10 yards in three downs.

When the ball is kicked, any player on the kicking side will be on side as soon as the ball touches the ground. Once the ball touches the ground it cannot be kicked further.

All forms of unnecessary roughness have been explained and penalties provided. When a player is disqualified his team will lose half the distance of its goal line.

One and only one forward pass is allowable to each scrimmage. The pass shall be made by a player who was behind the line of scrimmage when the ball was put in play and provided the ball after being passed forward, does not touch the ground before being touched by a player of either side. The ball cannot be touched by a player who was on the line of scrimmage but must be passed from a back field player to one of the ends. A ball passed over the scrimmage line within five yards from the center is forbidden. Only the side which puts the ball in play, can use the forward pass. A forward pass which crosses the goal line on the bounce is a touchback.

THE CENTRAL RAILROAD
