The land was purchased for \$15,000. The new owners will take possession today. This fall 1,000 laying hens will be placed upon it, and the number increased to 10,000. The largest chicken farm at present is said to contain 8,400.

To equip and stock the new farm will mean an outlay estimated at from \$40.-000 to\$50,000. Mr. Talmage is a retired wholesale druggist of Toronto.
