NEW TESTS FOR FIGHTING DISEASE

(Scripps News Association)
New York Oct. 5—Tests which are based on the theory that the blood of both human beings and animals contain a principal called opsonin, which acts upon harmful bacteria, are now being conducted in the Bacteriological laboratory of the Board of Health, which will, it is expected, modify, if not revolutionize the method of treating diseases with serum. As there is a wide variation in the power to resist disease, inoculations with serum presented many difficulties, but it is now claimed that by gauging the power of the opsonin it is possible to determine to a minute degree how large an injection of serum a patient will be able to receive to produce beneficial results. It is expected that the new method will be of great value.
In the administration of serums for diptheria, vaccines for smallpox and possibly of tuberculin for the treatment of tuberculosis.

WILLAMETTE COLLEGE OF THEOLOGY

Salem, Ore., Oct. 5—Benny W. Warren, senior bishop of the Methodist Episcopal church, Monday afternoon dedicated the Kimball school of theology of Willamette University in the presence of the Oregon conference, the members of which reached this city on a special train, journeying from Portland in a body, a thing that never occurred before.
The dedication of the Kimball school marked an epoch in Western Methodism, as it was an event never before experienced in the Pacific Northwest, and the Oregon conference members, the high officers, expressed their deep gratitude at the presence of their senior bishop at the services.
The Kimball school was but recently completed. It is an attractive building that adds greatly to the appearance of the grounds on which are located the Willamette University proper and other structures belonging to the institution. It was presented to the University by Mrs. Kimball, wife of Dean H. D. Kimball, who wished to express their faith and confidence in the president, Dr. John H. Coleman, whom they have known in past years. Feeling the great need of a theological school in this section of Methodism and believing Willamette University would improve and multiply its value with such a department, Mrs. Kimball decided to build one and present it, and Dean Kimball will devote his services graciously as head of the school.

Garver of this city, agent and attorney for the anti-saloon in Eastern Oregon, has just returned from an extended trip over Wallowa county, in which he made close observations as to the effect of the local option law now in force in that county. He says that there are no gallon houses in the county as reported, and that bootleggings is vigorously prosecuted five indictments against bootleggers having just been returned by the grand jury.
