THE DECREASING RUBBER SUPPLY

The decreasing rubber supply has resulted in a sharp and apparently permanent advance in prices. A Madagascar journal, according to a consular report. has compiled figures on the world's supply of rubber last year, and places this at 57,000 tons, one-third produced in South America and one-fifth in Africa. It was all used, nearly half of it coming to the United States. The world's production this year is estimated at 75,000 tons. valued at \$116,000,000. The price of Congo rubber has advanced in four years from \$1.54 to \$2.38 per kilogram of 2. 2
