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# FFARS HUSBAND WILL STEAL BOY

The following is clipped from a Los Angeles paper bearing date of Oct. 6.

Mrs. Lena Letts, living with her father and mother, her two children and her sister, Miss Adele Pfeffele, at 626 San Pedro street, has asked Prosecuting Attorney Guy Eddie for protection from her husband who, she said she fears is trying to kidnap her boy, D. M. Letts, Jr.

Letts lives at 614 Rith avenue, and until last Monday the others of the family resided there also. On last Sunday, it is alleged by Mrs. Letts and her sister. misunderstandings between the couple which had already caused two separations culminated in personal violence, when Letts is said by both Mrs. Letts and her sister, to have chocked Miss Pfeffele, thrown his wife to the floor and was only stopped when Miss Pfeffele covered him with a revolver, and drove him out of the house.

"My husband deserted me when I was ill and in a destitute condition," Mrs. Letts told attorney Eddie, "and had it freight cars pop inter view; an' we have not been for \$20 given me by the city a good many freight cars all threw life. council of La Grande, Ore., and other assistance tendered me by total strangers, my children and myself would have staryed. In spite of this he persuaded me again to live with him and at once began his ill-treatment. The result is the present trouble and had it not been for my sister I should have been a tota wreck. As it is, I am nervous and frightened because I know he is trying to kidnap my boy and just as soon as the money can be secured I shall institute divorce proceedings."

Miss Pfeffele does not appear to be a day over 18. yet is the present sole support of the six people. bearing her hurden with a light heart, but still finding time to protect her nephew.

"I will protect my slater and nephew to the end," she said last night, "and if Dave Letts tries to molest her or get the boy I will kill him, as I told the prosecuting attorney I would."
