SCHOOL GIRL IS HEROINE

The Elgin Recorder of yesterday relates the following:

Floyd Galloway, who is attending the State Normal school at Weston, gives an account in a letter which his parents received this week, of how Glens Merritt, young lady of this city, who is attending the same school, rescued Miss Anna Richards, of Cove, from the railroad trestle near Weston Monday and probably saved her life.

Just prior to the arrival of the 4:30 passenger train in Weston five of the young ladies from the Normal were out walking and were crossing the long trestle when the train came in. It appears the girls did not hear the train until it was close upon them. Three of the girls who were in advance of Misses Merritt and Richards crossed in safety but the Richards' girl became panic stricken and stood helpless in the middle of the track. Glens, who was a few feet in advance of the terror-stricken girl returned and half carried and half dragged the helpless girl to safety at the end of the trestle, where the other companions stood frightened beyond action. When the heroine reached a place of safety with her helpless victim the train was within less than fifteen feet of her, and it was due to her quick action and bravery that the girl was saved, as from all accounts it seems the engine crew knew nothing of the presence of the girl. It was an act of bravery and not one girl in a hundred would have gone back, facing death as it seemed to rescue the other.
